In accordance with the National Environmental Protection Agency, lead is the single most serious environmental health hazard affecting children today. The main sources of lead poisoning in children are from deteriorated lead based paint, contaminated soil and lead-contaminated drinking water.

Make sure you do your homework in choosing a lead certified renovator or you may find yourself in trouble with the law. Your local or state health departments will be able to help you attain a list of lead certified trained professionals. Many construction and remodeling professionals today still do not know about the harmful effects of lead. They may not even know that simple repainting, remodeling or renovation projects can cause lead poisoning.

*According to ConsumersUnion.org advice for Consumers includes:

Reduce lead exposure in the home – Consumers who live in pre-1978 housing should evaluate lead risks in their home, whether or not they have children. The main concerns are deteriorating paint, dust, soil, and water.

Have children tested for lead – The Environmental Protection Agency recommends all children be tested at ages 1 and 2. Some pediatricians also recommend testing at annual checkups under age 6.

Check recall lists – Consumers should go to www.cpsc.gov for photos and descriptions of toys and other products recalled due to lead contamination.

Consume adequate calcium and iron – People whose diets don’t contain sufficient amounts absorb more lead.
